If Law is the provisioning of existence, then it makes sense that the law is vested in social forms as language in the constitution (or is it constituation?) of societal forms.


In other words: "The Law" is the provisioning of 'social agency' as constituted in the identification of agents as societal entities.

Going deeper:

 I think Purpose can be defined as the self organizing principle of agency formation and realization

Identity becomes the interface of agency being and knowing provisioned within intersubjective relations across constructions of social identification
identification becomes the negotiation of agency representation
Trust becomes the integral currency of legal codification,
Legal Codification becomes the representation of agency provisioning in the constitution of societal forms (ie. constructions of agency identification relations in social timespace),

- Note that Legal Codification (representation of agency provisioning in the constitution of societal forms) is extended from agency provisioning through the negotiation of trust (through identification), from the self organizing principle of agency formation (Purpose)
